
STEP BACK IN TIME WHEN YOU BOARD THE MULTI AWARD-WINNING BRUNEL'S SS GREAT BRITAIN. LAUNCHED IN 1843 TO PROVIDE LUXURY TRAVEL TO NEW YORK, THE WORLD'S FIRST GREAT OCEAN LINER SET NEW STANDARDS IN ENGINEERING, RELIABILITY AND SPEED.

Find out about the passengers and crew – from the rich and famous, to the poor leaving 1850's England to start a new life in Australia.

The iron ship's story is rich in triumphs, disaster, personal tragedy and joy, culminating in the ss Great Britain's dramatic rescue and return in 1970 to her original dry dock.

The Dockyard Museum charts the fascinating history of Brunel's masterpiece and is packed with hands-on interactive displays and massive iron artefacts. Follow the captain's orders, to take the ship on a westerly course, prepare her for sail, and climb the crow's nest.

A personal audio 'companion' will guide you around the vast ship – from the luxury of the First Class Dining Saloon, to the cramped steerage accommodation, and smoky engine room. There's a choice of tours for adults and children, including French and German.



Descend into the ss Great Britain's Dry Dock, under the glass 'sea', for a close up view of the ship's giant hull and screw propeller, and the state-of-the-art equipment saving her for the next 100 years by keeping the atmosphere as dry as the Arizona Desert.

Access for all!


Brunel's ss Great Britain is one of the world's most accessible historic ships with lifts for wheelchair users, specialist British Sign Language (BSL) guides for the Deaf, and audio guides for the blind and visually impaired. Guide and hearing dogs are welcome, as are dedicated assistants who have free entry.
